Guest Speaker Sarah Beaupre', Development Associate, San Diego Oasis. Sarah presented the history and goals of Oasis. Its goal is successful aging for its members and participants. Oasis offers a large variety of classes and trips year round; it is based on a trimester system for offerings. It relies on volunteers for the programs. Oasis also partners with library branches throughout San Diego County. It offers online and paper catalogs.

Oasis new location and address is 5500 Grossmont Center Drive Suite 269, La Mesa, CA 91942. Current enrollment is about 5500 participants. Membership is free to those who are 50 years old and older.

Lobby Day and the Presidents' Board Meeting will be held April 9 to 11, 2018 in Sacramento.

April 20th is the beginning for delegates for the Delegate Assembly. For Chapter 17 there are 4 officers to be elected and there is no competition for those offices. There will be voting for the 7 delegates to Delegate Assembly.

Diane announced that Margaret Brown, a new CalPERS Board member, will Be Chapter 17's guest speaker for the June 2018 meeting.

CalPERS Report

Elaine Edwards-Yahraus

The Discount Rate has been lowered from 7.5 to 7%---more monies from employers and employees. CalPERS has 1.9 million members and the average monthly allowance for all retirees is \$2,876. There are only 3% of the members who earn pensions greater than \$100,000. These are typically city leaders, physicians, and university employees.

Elaine distributed a handout outlining the Medicare Changes to ID Cards to Prevent Fraud. New Medicare cards will be mailed out starting in April 2018. The mailings will be over a period of time. The cards will have a unique eleven digit number which will not be the Social Security number. CalPERS Medicare retirees won't have to take any action. CMS will provide CaIPERS with the new Medicare numbers.

The Health Plans will have the same deductibles as last year. The rates as of this date have not be determined and are still pending.

Sub Committee

Laurie Bella – Elaine Edwards- Yahraus – Networking with San Diego Retiree Groups - Security Roundtable -

The Retirement Security Roundtable was held on March 21, 2018 in San Diego. There were updates on the California Rule Court Case, San Diego Proposition B appeal, Reed/DeMaio Initiatives, Secure Choice Programs update and Supreme Court decision on union dues update. The next meeting will be October 3, 2018 in San Diego.

Old Business

Beverly Durcan reported on the Chapter 17 picnic plans. After discussion regarding a date, it was decided that October 4, 2018 would be a good date. This is also a regular Chapter 17 meeting date. The location will be the bay side of the Mission Bay Hilton Hotel which is off interstate 5. Steve will bring his bar-be-que setup and do the bar-be-quing for the group. Chapter 17 will provide the meat, drinks and paper goods for the picnic. The starting time will be 10:30-11:00 a.m. on October 4, 2018.

District G Report

Gaspar Luna Oliveira, District G Director

Gaspar reported the Chapter 17 nominations for the officers: President, Elaine Edwards; Vice President, Steve Haley: Secretary, Gloria Koch, and Treasurer, Diane Whorton –all uncontested. He also outlined that there are 7 delegate positions to be filled for Chapter 17 with 9 candidates. Ballots need to be returned to Sacramento by May 21, 2018 at 5 pm.

Gaspar stated that Lobby Day is scheduled for April 10 and 11, 2018. Dinner is on the 10th with the guest speaker, David Miller, a new CalPERS Board member; Lobby Day at the Capitol on the 11th.

Regarding the Delegate Assembly, Gaspar said that District G has 16 representatives from the 4 Chapters in District G. In the State, some Chapters are very small and others are extremely large, such as a Sacramento Chapter that has 8,000 members. There may be some changes coming during this next year on the delegate allocations.

The current building where CSR is located is being sold by CSEA. A new building is being purchased by CSEA and CSR will be renting space from CSEA in the new location.

In summary, Gaspar indicated that CalPERS is constantly under attack by groups regarding investments and returns. He said that the downturn of the stock market in 2008-2009 impacted all of us, including CalPERS. At this time, CalPERS invests in Global Equities.
